

Discuss Campaign Finance Reform with Representative Rayfield

Oregonians made real progress on losing its reputation for being the “Wild West” for big money in our political system during the past legislative session. Most importantly, the legislature referred SJR18 to the Nov 2020 ballot, which would amend the OR state constitution to allow limits on campaign contributions/expenditures and so-called Tag Lines on political ads.

But in addition to passing this very important reform, Oregon also needs to enact real limits, not just permission to have limits. What do you think those limits should be? How should we deal with dark money? How should PAC money be used to impact elections?

Come hear about Oregon's recent progress toward reducing the impact of money in politics -- and weigh in on our next steps.
